A film festival to focus on Sikh life

For several years, Paul S Johar, a dentist with a flourishing private practice, has been wondering how to make the annual Sikh film festival in New York more appealing. He was deeply involved with the festival called *Spinning Wheel*, whose New York edition was run by Sikh Arts founded by his uncle Tejinder Pal Singh Bindra. Bindra asked Johar last year if he would run a Sikh film festival independent of *Spinning Wheel*.

"There were many things we wanted to do that the other festival was not ready to do it," Johar said as he discussed the *Sikh Film Festival* to be held at the Asia Society all through the day on October 4. "For one thing, we are giving away cash prizes totaling \$15,000 for the films in various genres." He added that, in the coming years, the cash prizes could be increased and given in many categories.

"Our idea is to get people at large to know about the Sikh community through the events like this film festival," Johar said. "We are advertising the festival not only in the Indian media but also in mainstream publications."

"We are very also keen on the second- and third-generation Sikhs [knowing] about their faith, traditions and history," he added, "not only in India but also in other countries. The films we are showing also focus on Sikh life and issues in America."

The festival, which will screen a feature film, is also offering the following documentaries: *Sikhs in America*, an Emmy Award winner; *A Dream in Doubt*, featured on PBS Independent Lens; and *Pahelwani - History, Tradition and Art of Punjabi Wrestling*.

"The documentary on wrestling is something very unusual," he said. "It pays homage to a fast-dying tradition. Now, at least on the film, we could say we have preserved the tradition."

Also showing at the festival is *Kabaddi Cops*, in which director Gregory Cote unfolds the story of a group of police officers from the Toronto, Canada, area who take up Kabaddi

appeal is universal. "It speaks to the universal challenge of how so many people [not just Sikhs] have to balance romance, family, ethics and spirituality in today's complex world," he explained.

"These films ask pertinent questions about what it means to be a Sikh in modern day America," Johar says. "But we will be glad to show films which also celebrate the larger Punjabi culture. And we are not shying away from showing films that question things that are happening in the Sikh community."

For instance, the festival had scheduled a documentary on the gang fights between Sikh youth in Vancouver, British Columbia. But the film was dropped from the schedule as the Canadian National Film Board, which produced it, decided to send it to another film festival which wanted an exclusive showing. The festival will follow a Sikh Heritage Gala at Cipriani at which a number of people will be honored. The honorees

include Stuart Rabinowitz, president of Hofstra University, which set up a Sikh studies chair established by the Bindra family six years ago. From the United Kingdom, Susan Stronge, senior curator at the Asian Department of the Victoria and Albert Museum, will also be honored for her commitment to Sikh art and heritage.

to bond with the South Asian community.

The feature film, *Ocean of Pearls*, directed by Sarab S Neelam, focuses on a Sikh man with a turban and beard in Toronto who takes up a well-paying job in Detroit at a state-of-the-art transplant center. A number of personal and professional events lead him to question his tradition.

Neelam's film has an autobiographical touch. He has said the film seeks to break down barriers just as African-American leaders sought to do for their community.

He describes *Ocean of Pearls* as the story of a young Sikh doctor struggling with the inequities of the American health system and ultimately his own identity. The film goes beyond the issue of Sikh identity, he said, adding that it
